

Rebecca Clothey is a Professor of Education and Head of the Department of Global Studies and Modern Languages at Drexel University. Her PhD is in the Social and Comparative Analysis of Education from the University of Pittsburgh. She has been an active participant in the Society for the past 25 years.

She is an interdisciplinary scholar whose research interests explore the politics of knowledge, with a focus on education policy, ethnicity, and community-driven education initiatives in China, the U.S., and Türkiye. Her most recent projects have focused on Uyghur refugee communities in the US and Türkiye and the ways in which they navigate structural barriers to meet their goals. Her passion for international education began while attending an international boarding school in Tamil Nadu, South India as a youth, and her global interests have continued to expand ever since. She has lived for extended periods in India, China, Türkiye, the United States, and Bosnia-Herzegovina.

She has authored over 40 articles and book chapters, and co-edited 4 books. Her research has been funded by grants from Fulbright, including one to China and one to Uzbekistan; the Spencer Foundation; NEH-ARIT; Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) and the Drexel Social Science Research Fund among others. In 2021-2022, she was awarded the Drexel University Provost Award for Outstanding Mid-Career Scholarly Achievement.
